Members to donate more than 1908 items to North Mobile County School System's Self-Care Hygiene Closets

(September 30, 2022) -- More than 1,00 African American professional women representing the South Eastern Region of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated® (AKA) will convene this weekend in Mobile, Alabama, for the 2022 Alabama Statewide Cluster. The day-long meeting on Saturday, October 1 at the Mobile Convention Center will focus on business matters and the latest programs of the oldest Black Greek letter organization established by African American college-educated women in the U.S.

The Cluster is the final one of three conferences occurring across the South Eastern Region's (SER) service area that encompasses Tennessee, Mississippi and Alabama. SER is comprised of approximately 116 Chapters and more than 13,000 members.

AKA South Eastern Regional Director Tracey Morant Adams cited the city for its location, meeting facilities and hotel accommodations. "Our members are excited to gather here, and we look forward to productive sessions while also giving back to the community," said Adams.

In keeping with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated's legacy of serving and uplifting communities, the organization will contribute clothing and personal care items to the Self-Care Hygiene Closets in North Mobile County Schools. The closets collect and provide items to students of all ages. As needed, the students visit the closets to select free clothing and products for their personal use.

Following consultation with the agency, South Eastern Region members were asked to donate needed items such as socks, underwear, soap, body wash, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, hair combs and brushes, toothpaste, mouthwash, floss, paper towels and toilet paper. The items will be collected at the Cluster meeting and delivered to the Self-Care Hygiene Closets. The goal is to collect a minimum of 1,908 items. The number 1908 is the year that the sorority was founded.
