# Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated® To Host 71<sup>st</sup> Mid-Atlantic Regional Conference In Charlotte April 11-14; Free Community Job Fair Scheduled For April 11 At Johnson C. Smith University

More Than 5,500 Members Registered for Four-Day Conference; Community Career and Job Fair Powered by TIAA Will Feature Over 40 Employers

**CHARLOTTE, N.C.**— More than 5,500 members of <u>Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated</u>® – the oldest service organization founded by college-educated African American women in 1908–will travel to Charlotte, North Carolina, for its 71st <u>Mid-Atlantic Regional</u> Conference from April 11-14, 2024.

Members will attend conference events and workshops and participate in several activities, including the Region's first-ever <u>Community Career and Job Fair</u> and other events that are open to the general public. Conference attendees will leave an impact locally through a community book drive that supports literacy efforts in the greater Charlotte community for children in grades K-5 in partnership with the Charlotte Hornets Book Bus.

"I am thrilled that the Mid-Atlantic Region of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated® will bring 5,500 members and our sought-after service and signature sisterhood to the Queen City for our 71<sup>st</sup> Regional Conference," said Nadine Vargas Stewart, Mid-Atlantic Regional Director for Alpha Kappa Alpha. "We plan to make a lasting impact in Charlotte through our service project, as well as the new Community Career and Job Fair in partnership with Johnson C. Smith University. As the 15<sup>th</sup> largest city in the U.S., the fair offers a tangible way to expand opportunities for the community and our members who seek positions in high-demand industries in North Carolina and the region."

"We are excited to have the Mid-Atlantic Region of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., return to Charlotte for its regional conference this year," said Mike Butts, Charlotte Regional Visitors Authority Vice President of Sales and Visit Charlotte Executive Director. "Members of the sorority have positively impacted the city's hospitality industry during past conferences by staying in hotels, eating at our award-winning culinary establishments, shopping at our array of retail

outlets, as well as visiting cultural and entertainment attractions. We expect the economic impact to continue this year when members turn Charlotte into a sea of pink and green. ### **Community Career and Job Fair**

A free community job fair sponsored by the Mid-Atlantic Region of <u>Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority</u> will include Fortune 500 businesses, local, state and government agencies from 10 a.m.-2 p.m., at <u>Johnson C. Smith University</u> on Thursday, April 11. The onsite event will include workshops with corporate sponsor <u>TIAA</u>, along with <u>NCWorks</u> and <u>Charlotte Works</u>. Nearly 40 other confirmed businesses and organizations will represent industries ranging from banking and finance and retail to education and construction and logistics. Targeted sectors include white-collar and blue-collar, as well as private, public and government entities. Several national entities and companies with a presence in North Carolina and Virginia will be onsite, with most companies located in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg area. Companies that offer remote positions will also be part of the fair.

"The Mid-Atlantic Region's Community Career and Job Fair will allow individuals who are interested in exploring career opportunities—whether they are recent graduates, career changers or seasoned professionals—to interact directly with recruiters," said Harriett Johnson, Mid-Atlantic Job Fair Committee Chairman. "The fair will also allow job seekers to better understand different industries and make meaningful connections."
