America's First Sorority of African American Women to Convene in Jackson, MS for Statewide Meeting

Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated® South Eastern Region to donate several hundred books to the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Mississippi

(September 25, 2024) – One local charity will receive a deluge of children's books when one thousand women representing the South Eastern Region of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated® (AKA) arrive for the Mississippi Statewide Cluster, Saturday, September 28, 2024. The day-long meeting at Jackson Convention Complex will focus on business matters and initiatives of the oldest Black Greek letter organization for women in the U.S.

In keeping with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority's legacy of service and uplifting communities, the members of AKA will bring new books to donate to the Boys and Girls Clubs of Central Mississippi (BGCCM). The community service project is intended to help enrich the reading and comprehension skills of local students in kindergarten through third grade.

According to AKA South Eastern Regional Director Dr. Tracey Morant Adams, the city of Jackson's location, meeting facilities, hotel accommodations, and overall hospitality provide the ideal setting for the business meeting. "Our site selection team was graciously and warmly welcomed, and we believe this is an indication of the experience our members will have while here," said Adams.

The meeting is one of three Clusters hosted by the South Eastern Region (SER) this year. SER is comprised of approximately 119 chapters and more than 14,000 members in Tennessee, Mississippi, and Alabama.
